

Identification of Consonants

Consonants are a group of letters in the English alphabet that are pronounced by stopping or obstructing the airflow from the mouth.

The 21 consonants in English are b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, y, and z.



Consonants can occur at the **beginning**, **middle**, or **end** of a word.

Examples of words with consonants at the beginning include "cat," "dog," "fish," and "hat."



Examples of words with consonants in the middle include "button," "turtle," and "zebra."



Examples of words with consonants at the end include "book," "desk," "lamp," and "pot."



To practice identifying consonants, you can try reading simple words out loud and identifying which letters are consonants.
