

# Parts of Speech

Parts of speech are the basic building blocks of the English language. Each part of speech serves a different purpose in a sentence.

Here's a brief overview of each part of speech:

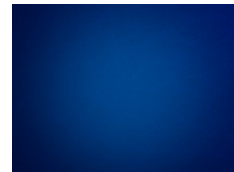
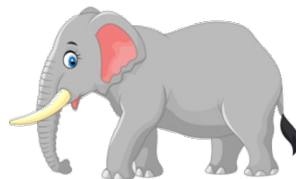
1. **Nouns:** Nouns are words that name people, places, things, or ideas. Examples: **cat**, **school**, **pen**.

5. **Pronouns:** Pronouns are words that take the place of nouns in a sentence.

Examples: **he**, **she**, **they**.



6. **Prepositions:** Prepositions are words that show the relationship between a noun or pronoun and other words in a sentence. Examples: **in**, **on**, **under**.



7. **Conjunctions:** Conjunctions are words that join words, phrases, or clauses together in a sentence. Examples: **and**, **but**, **or**.

8. **Interjections:** Interjections are words that express strong emotions or feelings.

Examples: **oh**, **wow**, **ouch**.
