

Past Tense

⇒ Simple Past Tense

The simple past tense is a verb tense used to describe a completed **action** or **event** in the past. It is formed by adding "-ed" to the base form of regular verbs or using the irregular past tense form for irregular verbs.

For example:

- **Regular verb:** "I walked to the store yesterday." (base form: walk + "-ed" = **walked**)
- **Irregular verb:** "She ate breakfast this morning." (past tense form: **ate**)

⇒ Forming the Simple Past Tense

A. Regular Verbs

To form the simple past tense for regular verbs, simply add '-ed' to the base form of the verb.

Examples:

- Play - played
- Work - worked
- Listen – listened



B. Irregular Verbs

Irregular verbs have unique past tense forms that do not follow the regular '-ed' rule. You need to memorize these forms.

Examples:

- Go - went
- Eat - ate
- Sing – sang



➡ Usage of the Simple Past Tense

A. Completed Actions

Use the simple past tense to describe actions that were completed in the past.

Examples:

- She visited her grandparents last summer.
- They finished their project on time.



B. Past Events

Use the simple past tense to discuss events that occurred in the past.

Examples:

- World War II ended in 1945.
- The concert started at 8 pm last night.



C. Habitual Actions in the Past

Use the simple past tense to describe actions that were habitual or occurred regularly in the past.

Examples:

- When she was a child, she played the piano every day.
- They used to walk to school together.



D. Past Facts and Generalizations

Use the simple past tense to state facts and generalizations that were true in the past.

Examples:

- People believed the Earth was flat centuries ago.
- He was a great athlete in high school.



➡ Time Expressions Commonly Used with Simple Past Tense

These time expressions are often used with the simple past tense to provide context about when an action or event occurred.

- Yesterday
- Last (week, month, year, etc.)
- (A specific time) ago
- In (a specific year or time period)
- When (referring to a specific event in the past).
