⇔ Should

"Should" is a modal verb used to express obligation, advice, and expectation.

- "Should" is used to express the speaker's opinion or recommendation about what someone ought to do.
- "Should" is used to express a moral or social obligation.
- "Should" is often used to give advice or make suggestions.
- "Should" is used to express a likely or expected outcome.
- "Should" can be used in the first, second, or third person.
- When forming a question with "should," the subject and "should" are inverted.
- The negative form of "should" is "should not" or "shouldn't."

- Students should study hard if they want to pass their exams.
- We should respect our elders.
- You should consider taking a break if you feel stressed.
