

Modals

⇒ Should

"Should" is a modal verb used to express **obligation**, **advice**, and **expectation**.

- "Should" is used to express the speaker's **opinion** or **recommendation** about what someone ought to do.
- "Should" is used to express a **moral** or **social obligation**.
- "Should" is often used to give **advice** or **make suggestions**.
- "Should" is used to express a **likely** or **expected outcome**.
- "Should" can be used in the **first**, **second**, or **third person**.
- When forming a **question** with "should," the subject and "should" are **inverted**.
- The **negative** form of "should" is "**should not**" or "**shouldn't**."
