Phrasal Verb

Often, we come across phrases that are a combination of a simple verb with an adverb and/or a preposition. This phrase becomes a new verb with a meaning different from that of the simple verb. Such phrases are called Phrasal verbs.

A phrasal verb is formed in the following three ways:

- 1. Verb + preposition
- 2. Verb + adverb
- 3. Verb + adverb + preposition

Study the following examples:

- 1. Let's get on with the presentation now. (verb + preposition)
- 2. I will look after the baby. (verb + adverb)
- 3. I cannot put up with such misbehaviour. (verb + adverb + preposition)

Many words can be used as both adverb particles and prepositions.

1. The principal adverb particles are:

in inside off on out outside over forward(s)	round through under up upward(s) before behind below	past beyond by down downward(s) about above	between across along around away back backward(s)
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2. The following particles have the same meaning as their corresponding prepositions. These are exceptional.

out, away, back, backwards, downwards and forwards

3. When used with verbs of movement, with or without objects, there is generally no difficulty in understanding the meaning of the phrasal verb if the meaning of the adverb particles is known.

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Some Phrasal Verbs with Meaning

1. ask after : ask for the news of somebody

2. ask in : invite somebody into the room or house

3. ask out : invite somebody to an entertainment or a meal

4. back up : support

8. be out : be away from

9. be back : return from

10. blow up : explode

11. call on : visit

12. calm down : relax after being angry

13. call out : call someone; summon
