My mother is a teacher. She **teaches** small children.

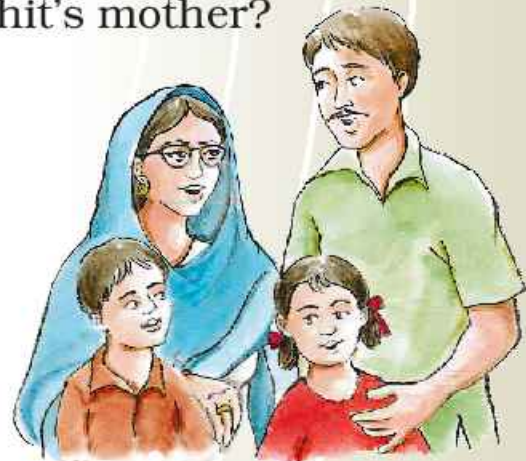


Our house is neat and clean. My father **helps** my mother. They **cook** good food for us.

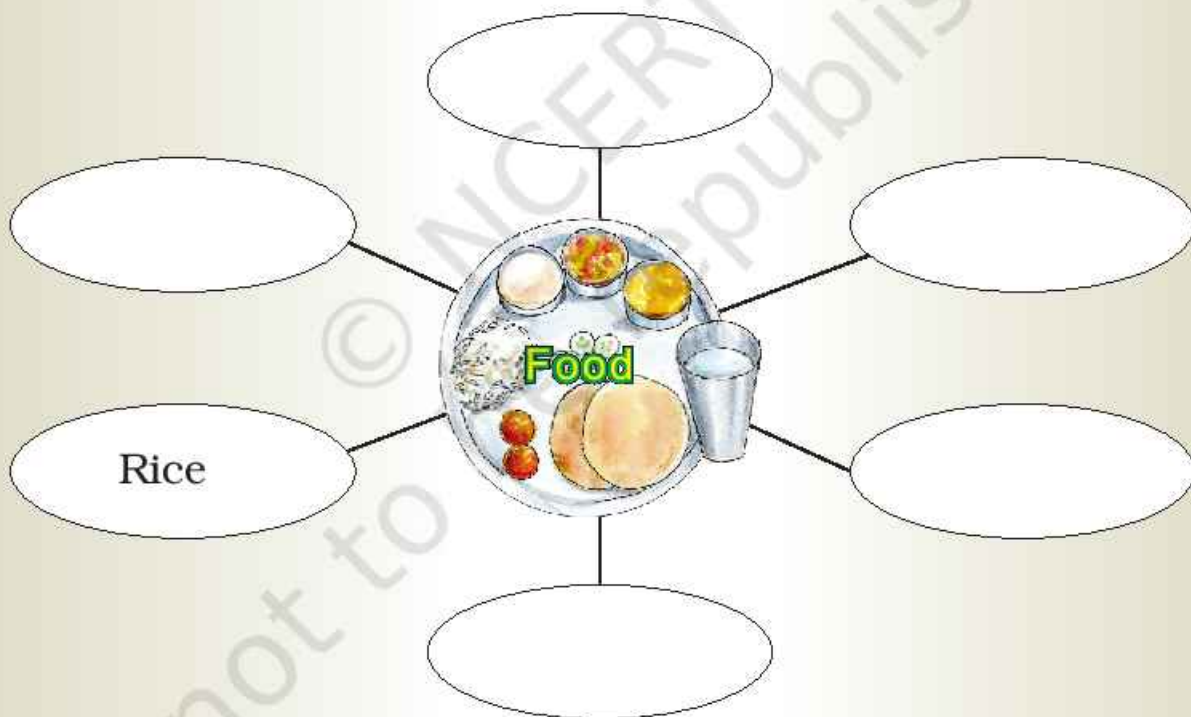
