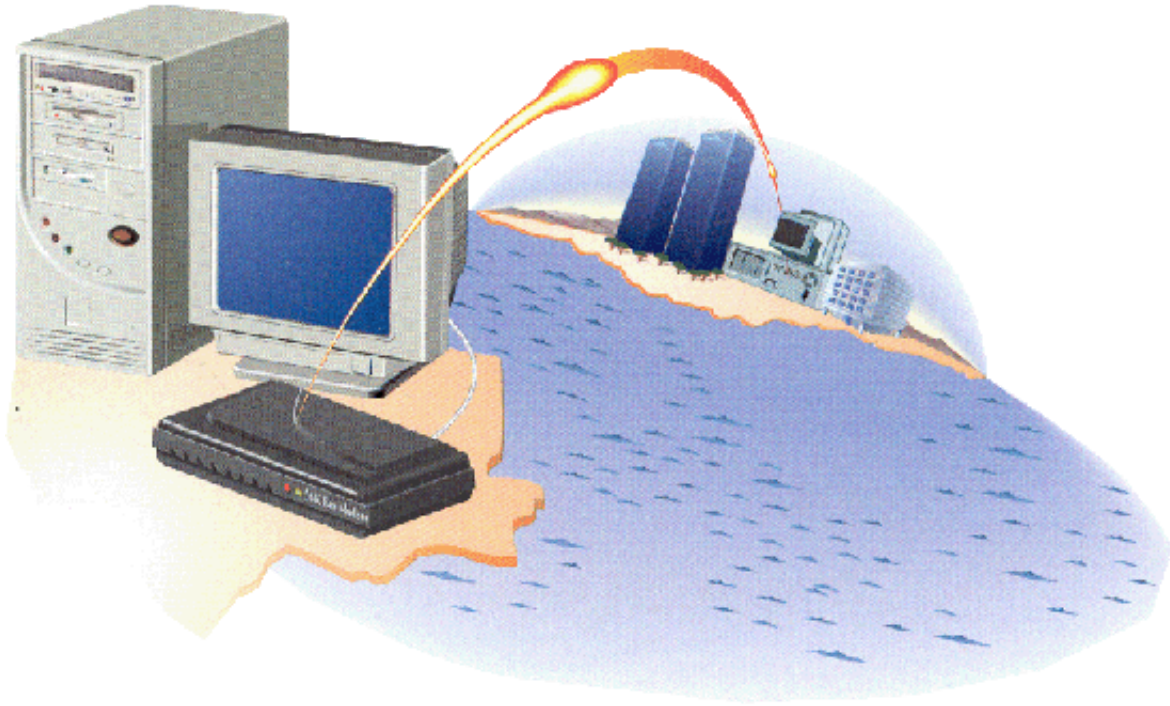


Modems
