




Grasping Grammar

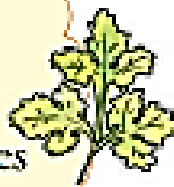



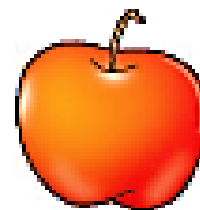
Smells

These are the odours I love well!



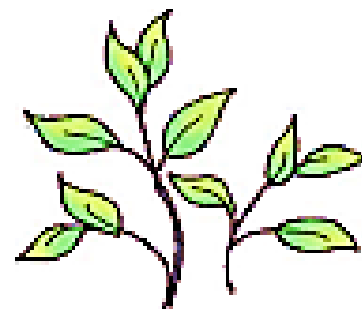
The smell of coffee freshly ground ;
