



Grasping Grammar

The two biggest groups of nouns are countable and uncountable nouns.

Countable Nouns (C)

A countable noun has a singular and a plural form. It is used for the things that can be counted.

For example: Apple, man, woman, horses etc.

Uncountable nouns (U)

Uncountable nouns do not have singular or plural form. They are used for the things that cannot be counted.

For example: Water, furniture, equipment, rice, sugar etc.
