# Grasping Grammar

Adjectives:

Words that are used before noun and add to its meaning are called adjectives.

There are three degrees of adjective:

1. Positive

: When there is no comparison and the adjective is used just for describing noun

For example: Mahesh is a tall boy

2. Comparative: When the adjective is used to compare between two individuals or groups.

For example: Mahesh is taller than Suresh

3. Superlative : When the adjective is used to compare one individual or group to many other.

For example: Mahesh is the tallest boy in the class.
