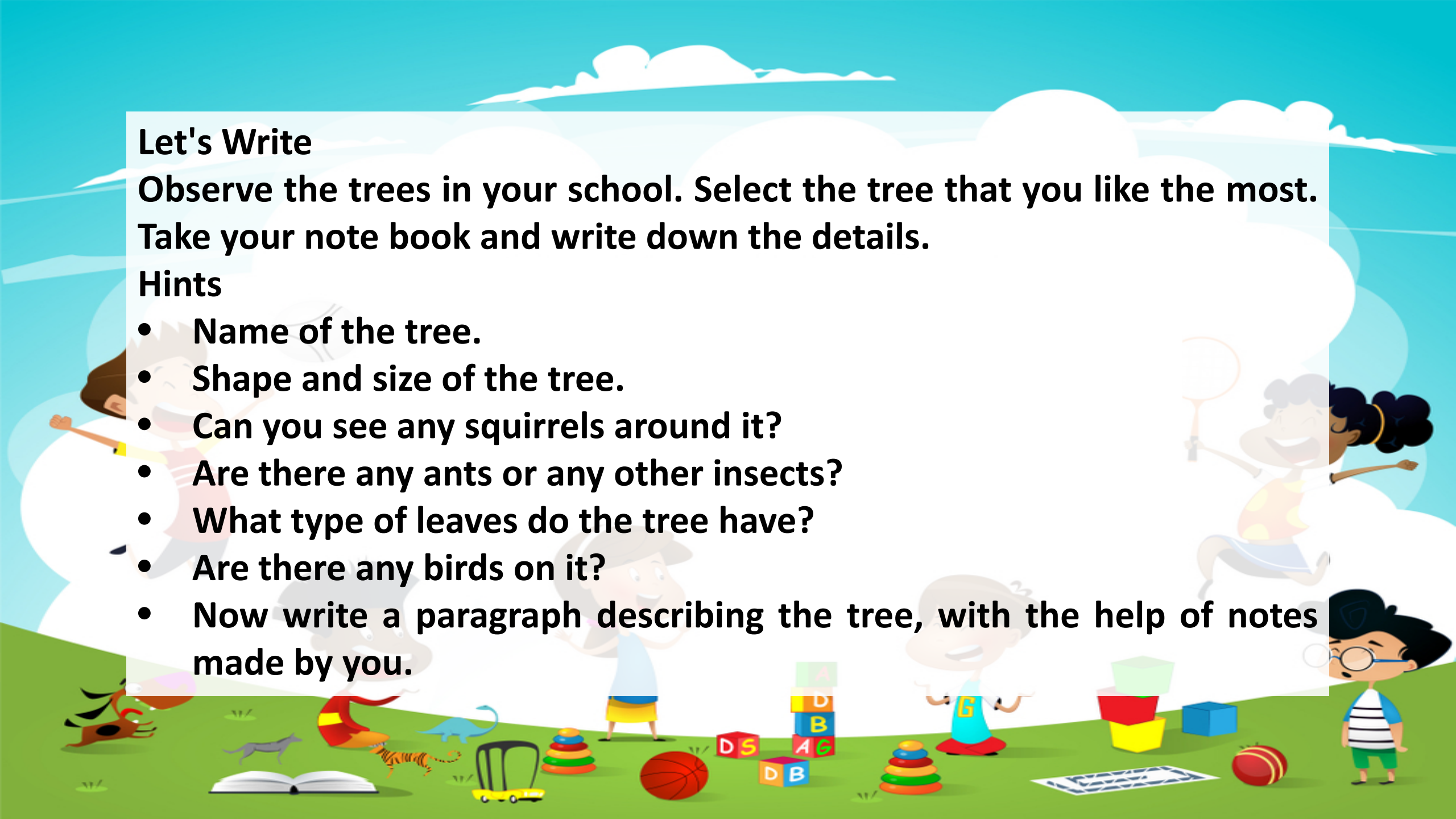


Let's Write

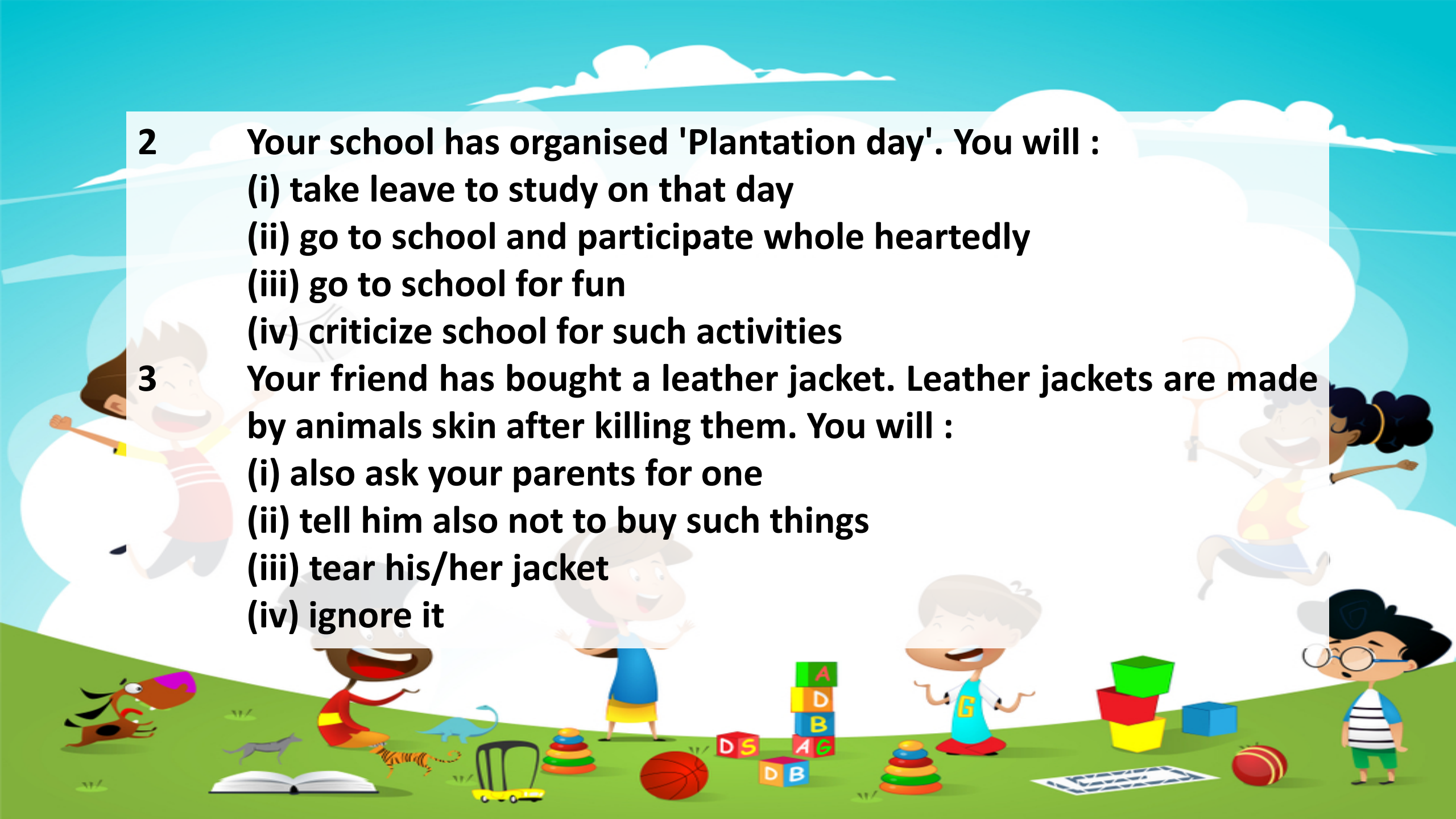
