Havildar Bachittar Singh, son of Sardar Rur Singh of Lop Village, Post Office Nihal Singh Wala, Ferozepore District, Punjab, was awarded the Ashoka Chakra posthumously. He led an attack on the enemy position with skill and determination. It was in September 1948 in Hyderabad.

Major Somnath Sharma, son of Major General A.N. Sharma, fought bravely. In spite of his right hand in plaster, he inspired his men to fight fearlessly. The brave action of Major Somnath Sharma stopped the surging enemy. Major Somnath Sharma prevented the enemy from capturing the airfield and saved the Kashmir Valley. He became the first winner of the highest Indian decoration for gallantry. He was awarded the param Vir Chakra posthumously on January 26, 1950.

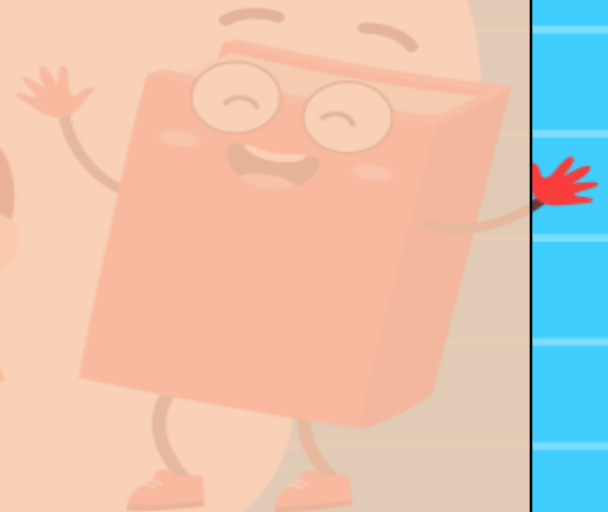
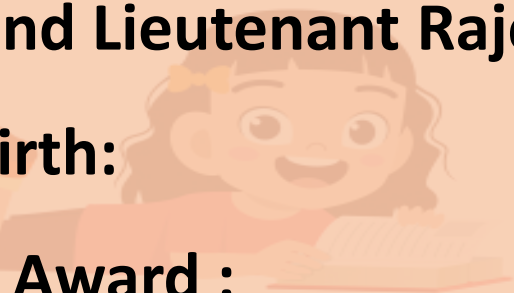
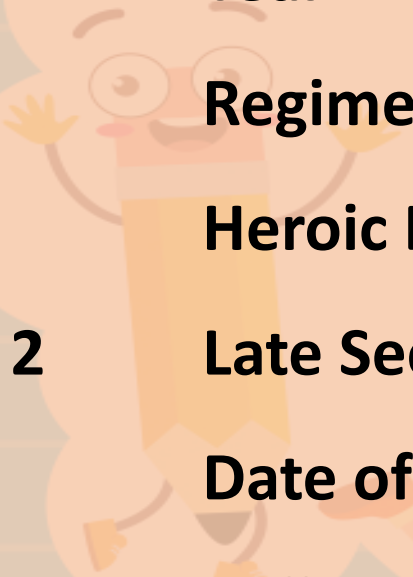

- **Give the factual description step by step.**

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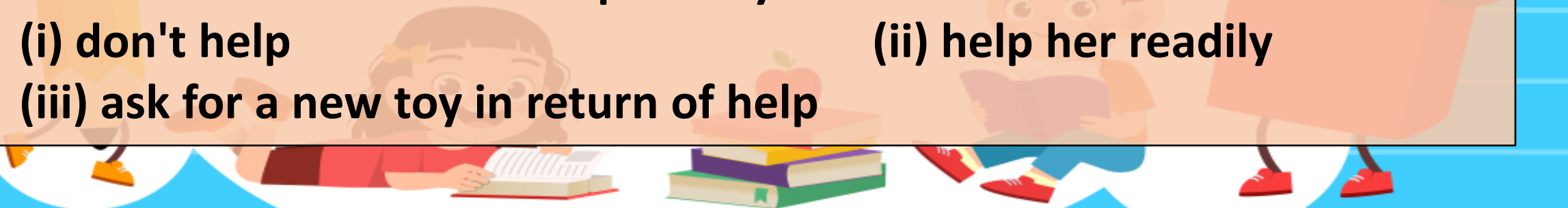
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**Read, Recite and Rejoice
