



Animal Rights

- 1 All animals are born free and have the same rights to life.
- 2 Every animal has the right to respect.
- 3 Man, should not wipe out other animals or violate this right by exploiting them; he has a duty to put his knowledge at the service of animals.
- 4 Every animal has the right to the attention, care and protection of man.

- 5 No animal shall be made to suffer either maltreatment or acts of cruelty.
- 6 Where the killing of an animal is necessary it shall be instantaneous, painless and not cause distress.
- 7 Every animal of a wild species has the right to live freely in its natural land, air or aquatic environment and to reproduce.
- 8 Any deprivation of liberty, even for educational purposes, is contrary to this right.

9 Every species of animal traditionally living in association with man has the right to live and grow in the conditions of life and liberty proper to that species.

10 Any change in these conditions made by man for commercial ends is contrary to this right.

11 Every animal which man chooses for a companion has the right to




