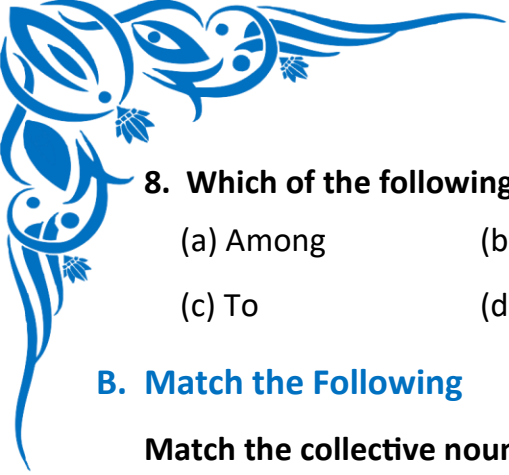

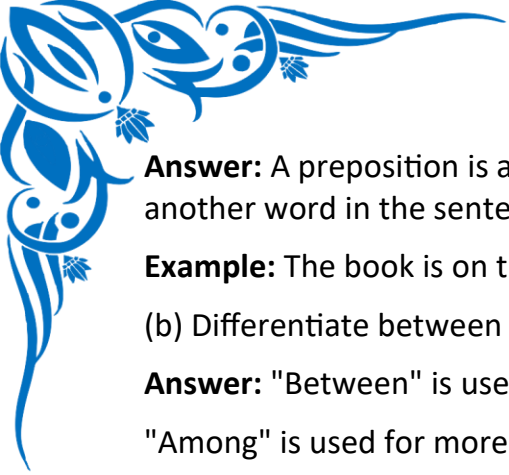

(a) Define a preposition with one example.



**Answer:** A preposition is a word that shows the relationship between a noun or a pronoun and another word in the sentence.

**Example:** The book is on the table.

(b) Differentiate between "between" and "among" with examples.
