In Wednesday's BMC order, addressed to the assistant municipal commissioners of all 24 wards, Pardeshi said many "essential and lifesaving medical equipment, IT systems related to health systems and machines/vehicles are in the state of disrepair due to closing down of the electronics and hardware shops and there is an urgent need to keep such shops open to some extent".

Minister Aslam Shaikh said he had pushed for opening some shops selling nonessentials like hardware, electronic goods in a meeting with Pardeshi on Wednesday. "Though these items are not considered essential, in this heat electronic goods shops are not less than essential. In summer, these shops should be opened so that people can buy or repair fans, air-conditioners or other electronic items," Shaikh told TOI. The final decision on which electronics and hardware shops should open will be with the local authorities.

The confusion continues in the Mumbai Metropolitan Region, where the order on opening standalone nonessential shops was tweaked by local authorities and saw uneven implementation. On Wednesday, Thanemunicipal commissioner Vijay Singhal revoked the permission to open non-essentials shops citing breach of lockdown norms.

The issue of opening shops selling non-essential items was discussed by the state cabinet on Wednesday. It decided to leave it to the local authorities to take a call on opening such shops, including liquor outlets, in their respective districts, considering the severity of the Covid-19 pandemic.

This was despite most ministers complaining about the local administration changing rules without consulting any minister. "There is a lot of confusion among traders and shopkeepers. Even people do not know what is allowed and when. There is a need for better communication between ministers, guardian ministers and the district administration," said a minister, on the condition of anonymity.

When the first train from Tamil Nadu after the Covid-19 lockdown rolled out of Katpadi railway station in Vellore on Wednesday night carrying 1,130 patients and their caregivers, thousands from across the country who throng the medical town saw the proverbial light at the end of the tunnel.

K VikashMahto, 22, and his brother Sandeep, 29, a chronic heart patient from Ranchi in Jharkhand, reached Vellore in Tamil Nadu on March 21 for a two-daytreatment at Christian Medical College

Hospital. They were to fly back home on March 23. But the Covid-19 outbreak and the ensuing lockdown stopped them. “We planned to stay for three days. By the 15th day after the lockdown, we could barely manage our daily needs,” said Vikash.

The lodge owner harassed them for rent and they did not have enough money to buy food. “My brother had breathing problems because of his heart condition and needed a bed,” said Vikash. They got the district superintendent of police to persuade the lodge owner to allow them to stay on. With the help of district officials and volunteers, the Mahto brothers got their daily ration. And, as arrangements were made to take them back home by train on Wednesday night, along with hundreds of other patients, the brothers finally had a smile on their face.

The special train, arranged on the request of the Jharkhand government will reach Hatia railway station in Ranchi early on Friday morning. Arrangements had been made by the Tamil Nadu government to take the patients and their attenders from private marriage halls and lodges to the Katpadi railway station in sanitized vehicles.

For the patients, it is not a one-way ticket; many said they would return. “I underwent an orthopaedic surgery four years ago at CMC hospital. I have to visit the hospital once a year for follow-up treatment,” said A Vikas Kumar Shaw, 31, a native of Dhanbad in Jharkhand, Vellore district revenue officer J Partheebantold TOI, “We provided them free accommodation and food in three private marriage halls. Those who needed cots and attached toilet facilities were put up in lodges.”

India went past two grim Covid-19 milestones on Wednesday—crossing the 50,000 mark overall and breaching the 3,000-figure in its daily tally for the first time. With 3,602 new cases—the most in a day till now—country's tally rose to 52,935. Alarming, while it took five days to go from the 30,000-mark to the 40,000-mark, the next 10,000 cases were added in just three days. It was on May 3 that the country had crossed 40,000 cases while the 30,000-mark was breached on April 28.

However, at 93, the death toll on Wednesday was less than half of the 199 casualties recorded across the country the previous day. Maharashtra alone accounts for 36.6% of the total 1777 casualties in India so far.

Delhi recorded its maximum number of cases in a day (428), pushing its count to 5,532. With one more death, the toll in the national capital now is 65.

Gujarat reported 28 more deaths, 25 of these from Ahmedabad alone, taking the toll to 396. With 380 fresh cases, the state's count is 6,625. As the situation remained grim in Ahmedabad, the administration banned sale of grocery, vegetables and fruits till May 15. Only milk and medicines sale will be allowed.

Municipal commissioner Mukesh Kumar said in a notification: "Super spreaders like those working in shops like vegetables, fruits, grocery, provisions, supermarkets, ice-cream parlours and people engaged in home delivery of these items as well as app based food delivery services become a potent source of infection for many."

Tamil Nadu saw another big surge in infections (771). As many as 324 of the cases were in Chennai and 188 in Ariyalur, with the Koyambedu cluster spreading across nearly two dozen districts.

The number of active Covid-19 cases are growing faster at 6.6%, leading to a shorter doubling time of 11 days, as compared to 15 days on May 2 when the growth rate of such cases was 4.8%, data analysis by economist Shamika Ravi, earlier part of the Prime Minister"s Economic Advisory Council, shows.

Ravi tweets daily updates that are widely followed on social media and her slides have on occasion been used by the government too. The trend is driven by concerns regarding states like Maharashtra, West Bengal, Gujarat, where the infection is at worrying levels.

In these states, mortality rates are increasing and there is no specific strategy for contact-tracing and testing, Ravi says. Pointing to varying rates of testing, Shamika said in Kerala's Kasargod when 100 people came out positive, 20,000 samples were tested while in Mumbai 6,000 samples were tested against 100 positive cases. According to her, there is a big second wave in several states with growing concerns in Gujarat, Delhi and Tamil Nadu, along with Maharashtra where the case load is alarmingly high.

"It is a combination of containment, contact-tracing and testing that will help flatten the curve. If containment and contact-tracing is poor, active cases will keep rising. States have to formulate a strategy and ensure it is strictly implemented," she said. So far, the government has said the doubling rate is rising with the figures taken for all cases and not only active ones as in Ravi's analysis.

The state reported its highest number of Covid deaths in a single day—43—on Thursday as the outbreak entered its 60th day in Maharashtra. The total count of people who have lost their lives to the virus reached 694, and with 1,216 new cases, the cumulative number of people affected by the infection went up to 17,974.

Mumbai, the epicentre of the pandemic in the state, accounted for 24 of the 43 deaths. On a day a team from the Centre came to the city to analyse the situation within the hotspots, 680 cases were added to the daily count, taking Mumbai's overall case tally to 11,394, the highest for any city in the country. BMC officials said of the new positives, 170 cases were from May 3 to May 5.

In a predawn disaster on Thursday that revived the horrors of the Bhopal gas tragedy 36 years ago, at least 11 people died and hundreds fell sick — many of them collapsing on roads and pavements — as they tried to escape toxic styrene vapours leaking from a chemical plant owned by South Korean firm LG in the densely populated Gopalapatnam area of Andhra Pradesh's Visakhapatnam.

Two of the victims in the gas leak, which started between 2.30am and 3am, were children. Ten more kids are among the 22 people said to be in a critical condition, leading government officials to fear the toll might rise. The state government evacuated 10,000 people living within a radius of 5km of the LG Polymers plant, whose holding company LG Chem was later booked for culpable homicide based on a complaint filed by the revenue officer of Venkatapuram village. Around 800 people were taken to hospitals, many of whom have since been discharged. "I woke up with a start at 4.30am and felt some uneasiness in breathing," said Dipankar Banerjee, an insurance executive who lives in the area.

There was a peculiar stench in the air, as if something was burning in kerosene. My wife woke up, too, and immediately started vomiting," he added.

Three women in an apartment next door became unconscious even as Banerjee, his wife and 11-year-old son scurried out of their house to join a crowd of people outside covering their noses and mouths to keep out the noxious stench of styrene, a liquid hydrocarbon that can leak at high temperature and evaporate easily into the atmosphere as vapour.

As the fumes spread, many breached the Covid-19 containment zones to take shelter in safer places. Gopalapatnam Society, a red zone, is barely a kilometre from the LG plant.

Thousands of people sprinted till they could breathe without inhaling the vapours. Those who could not run called police and disaster response teams for help. Some fell to the ground and lost consciousness. A few fainted inside their homes. Animals and plants didn't escape the toxic gas assault either. Cattle, dogs, cats and birds were found whimpering or lying still on roads and open spaces. Tree leaves sported a burnt look.

After weeks of improvement, India's doubling rate for Covid-19 cases worsened to 10.2 days in the last seven days with cases rising in states like Maharashtra, Gujarat and Delhi. On the other hand, the recovery rate has improved to 28.8%, and the fatality rate, at 3.3%, is among the lowest, health ministry data show.

On Tuesday, the health ministry had reported a doubling time of 12 days, just as the country saw the highest jump in cases and deaths. The deterioration of the rate is attributed, at least in part, to reporting gaps in certain states, such as Bengal, which are now being corrected. Compared to the rest of the world, India's fatality rate is lowest," health minister Harsh Vardhan said on Thursday, pointing to efforts to ensure timely reporting and efficient clinical management in combating Covid-19. The data also shows the disease in India to be of less in severity with just 1.1% of all Covid-19 patients on ventilators, 3.3% on medical oxygen and 4.8% in ICU beds.

India's testing capacity has also increased to 95,000 per day from around 75,000 daily at the beginning of the week. This is spread out in 327 government laboratories and 118 private laboratories. Cumulatively, over 13.57 lakh tests have been done so far.

As on Thursday, the health ministry reported a total of 52,952 Covid-19 cases. Of this, 15,266 persons have been cured and 1,783 deaths reported. In the last 24 hours, 3,561 new confirmed cases have been added and 1,084 patients cured. The current recovery rate is 28.8%. Flagging challenges in combating Covid-19 at a time when the disease graph has been gradually peaking instead of regressing as the government had hoped amid the lockdown, Harsh Vardhan said the challenge was to prevent the disease from making its way to unaffected districts. There are currently 319 unaffected districts in the green zone, 130 red districts and 284 orange ones. However, more and more districts, the minister said, were now managing to prolong the period of reporting of new infections, with 180 districts having no case between seven and 13 days; 164 districts with no case between 14 and 20 days; and 136 districts with no case from 21 to 28 days.

States across India reported more than 3,000 fresh Covid-19 cases for the second day running as the country's coronavirus count raced past the 55,000 mark on Thursday, taking just four days to reach the number after crossing 40,000 on May 3.

While Maharashtra recorded over 1,200 fresh cases on Thursday, the coronavirus infection touched a new high in Delhi, where 448 more cases were detected. The capital's previous single-day peak was 428 on Tuesday. The country also saw 106 fatalities from the virus, the second time that more than 100 patients have died in a day. Adding some cheer amid the gloom, the number of recoveries across India has been going up steadily. As per the latest data, more than 16,600 people have recovered across the country, which is nearly 30% of the total cases so far.

Meanwhile, the Covid-19 infection continued to surge in Tamil Nadu and Gujarat as well, with the two states reporting 580 and 388 new cases, respectively, adding to fears that the disease was leaping towards its peak in these states.

The coronavirus count in Gujarat, the second-most affected state, crossed 7,000 on Thursday. Out of the new cases, Ahmedabad district recorded 275, or 71% of the total.

Dharavi recorded 50 new Covid cases on Thursday, as a central team was on a visit there, and the tally went up to 783, including 21 deaths. The doubling of cases in Dharavi, one of the biggest slum pockets in the country, in six days indicates the seriousness of the situation. The team told BMC that considering Dharavi's population, the authorities have to arrange for more quarantine beds. They also

told BMC to clean community toilets more frequently. BMC has set up 3,000 beds at seven quarantine centres which are also being used as mini-clinics after providing round-the-clock doctors, nurses and oxygen cylinders for any emergency, and scanning those having fever and cough. The team was accompanied by civic chief Pravin Pardeshi, and Maharashtra school education minister and local MLA Varsha Gaikwad. The team examined quarantine facilities and clinics, and discussed the situation.

Civic officials took the team to a slum room, where over 12 persons were sleeping in a small space and there was no social distancing. A civic official explained the challenge to keep people inside congested rooms. They said many skilled labourers from the area desperately wanted to return to their home states.

Assistant municipal commissioner (G-North ward) Kiran Dighavkar said, "We are focussing on a containment strategy, comprehensive testing and uninterrupted supply of essentials. We tested 2,400 persons in the area, and are encouraging maximum to visit our clinics or quarantine facilities, if they have fever or cough for screening."

Civic officials said they are doing their best to provide groceries and other essentials in the high-risk zone so that people do not visit other areas. Dharavi is spread over 2.5 sq km and there are 202 containment zones there. There are 2,480 persons at BMC-managed institutional quarantine facilities, and 3,950 in home quarantine. Officials said there are 10 slum pockets in Dharavi, from where half the cases are.
