

Our Coins

Understanding the Topic

- We use money to buy things we need.
- Coins are small, round pieces of money.
- In India, coins come in different values like:
 - 1 rupee coin
 - 2 rupees coin
 - 5 rupees coin
 - 10 rupees coin
 - 20 rupees coin
- Each coin looks different in size, color, and number written on it.
- Coins have pictures and numbers to tell their value.
- We can add coins together to make bigger amounts.



Important Points


- A 1 rupee coin is the smallest among rupee coins.
- A 2 rupees coin is bigger than a 1 rupee coin.
- A 5 rupees coin is heavier and thicker.
- A 10 rupees coin is the biggest coin in normal use.
- Coins are made of metal and last a long time.

Examples with Solutions

Example: How many 1 rupee coins make 5 rupees?

Solution: 5 coins of 1 rupee each make 5 rupees.

Example: You have two 2 rupees coins. How much money do you have?



Solution: $2 + 2 = 4$ rupees

Example: Which is greater: a 5 rupees coin or a 2 rupees coin?

Solution: 5 rupees coin is greater.

Example: If you have a 10 rupees coin, how many 5 rupees coins do you need to make the same amount?

Solution: 2 coins of 5 rupees make 10 rupees.

Example: You have 1 rupee, 2 rupees, and 5 rupees coins. What is the total money?

Solution: $1 + 2 + 5 = 8$ rupees

Summary

- Coins are used to buy things and have different values like 1, 2, 5, and 10 rupees.
- Coins are different in size and weight.
- We can add coins together to make bigger amounts.
- 1 rupee coins are the smallest, and 10 rupees coins are the biggest among regular coins.
