Joining words are used to connect words, groups of words, or even full sentences. These words help in making our sentences more meaningful and less repetitive.

Definition

- A Joining Word is a word that joins together words, groups of words, or sentences.
- A joining word is also called a Conjunction.

Common Joining Words

• and – used to add or combine similar ideas.

Example: Rahul and Priya are friends.

• but – used to join opposite or contrasting ideas.

Example: He is tall but weak.

• or – used to show choices or options.

Example: Do you want tea or coffee?

Examples from the Book

Sentences Before Joining	After Joining
Litan has a bat. Litan has a ball.	Litan has a bat and ball.
Deepika is tall. Ritika is short.	Deepika is tall but Ritika is short.
Do you want tea? Do you want coffee?	Do you want tea or coffee?
