Definition of Pronouns

Pronouns are words used in place of naming words (nouns) to avoid repetition.

Example:

- This is Vishal. Vishal is six years old. Vishal likes painting.
- This is Vishal. He is six years old. He likes painting.

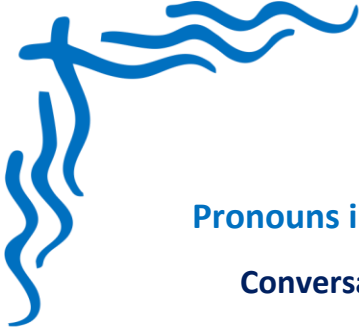
In the above example, "He" is a pronoun used instead of repeating "Vishal."

Commonly Used Pronouns

Pronoun	Used For	Example
I	When we talk about ourselves	I am doing my homework.
You	When we talk to another person	You are very kind.
He	A male person or boy	He is my uncle's son.
She	A female person or girl	She is my aunt's daughter.
It	An object or animal	It is very hot today.
We	A group including ourselves	We are going to the park.
They	A group not including ourselves	They are my cousins.

Grammar Byte: Usage Rules

- **I** – Used by the speaker to refer to themselves.
- **You** – Used to talk to the listener.
- **He** – Used in place of a boy or man.
- **She** – Used in place of a girl or woman.
- **It** – Used for things and animals.
- **We** – Used when the speaker includes themselves in a group.
- **They** – Used for more than one person or thing (excluding the speaker).



Pronouns in Conversation: Example

Conversation:

- **Rahul:** What are you doing?
- **Varun:** I am doing homework.
- **Rahul:** Who is that boy with you?
- **Varun:** He is my uncle's son. And who is that girl?
- **Rahul:** She is my uncle's daughter. Can we go out?
- **Varun:** No, it is too hot. We will go another day.

Important Points to Remember

Pronouns help avoid repeating nouns. They make sentences clearer and shorter. Each pronoun has a specific usage based on gender, number, and context.
