

Describing words

Introduction:

Describing words are words that tell us more about a person, place, animal, or thing. These words help make our sentences more interesting and detailed. The poem in the chapter uses words like **bright, beautiful, great, small, wise, wonderful, little, glowing, tiny** to describe nouns.

Definition:

Describing Words are called Adjectives. They add more information about a noun (naming word).

Example:

- My father has a new BMW car.
 - **Noun:** car
 - **Adjectives:** new, BMW

How to Identify Adjectives:

1. Find the noun or pronoun in the sentence.
2. Look for words that describe it — these are the adjectives.

Examples from Text:

1. This is a big house.
2. That is a tall giraffe.
3. This is a red apple.
4. That is a new car.
5. The grass is green.

Adjectives used: big, tall, red, new, green

Each word describes the noun that follows it.

Types of Information Adjectives Give:

i. Colour, Shape, Size

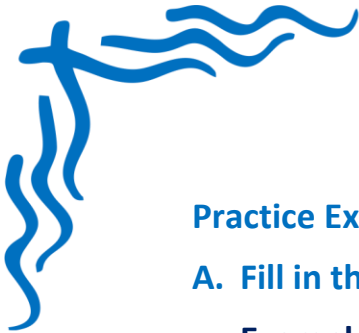
- black crow
- round table
- tall building

ii. Special Quality

- hot coffee
- fat girl

iii. Number

- four glasses
