Concept of Zero

Understanding the Topic

- Zero means nothing or no object
- It shows that there is none left or something is empty
- Zero is written as 0
- We use zero when there is no count or no item
- It helps in counting, subtraction, and understanding empty sets

How to Understand Zero

- Step 1: Count objects. If there is nothing, we write 0
- Step 2: Use zero to show that nothing is left
- Step 3: Remember, zero means no value
- Step 4: We don't write number names for zero objects

Examples with Solutions

Example 1: There are no apples in the basket.

Answer: 0 apples

Example 2: Tina had 2 pencils. She gave both away. How many are left?

2 – 2 = 0

Answer: 0 pencils are left

Example 3: There are 0 balloons in the box.

Answer: The box is empty

Example 4: How many stars do you see on a blank card?

Answer: 0 stars

Example 5: Ron had 3 candies. He ate all 3. How many are left?

3 - 3 = 0

Answer: 0 candies are left
