One Hundred

Understanding the Topic

One Hundred is written as 100. It is the first 3-digit number. One hundred means ten groups of ten or 100 ones. It has 1 in the hundreds place, 0 in the tens place, and 0 in the ones place. We use the number 100 to count, compare, and group things easily

How to Understand the Number 100

Step 1: Know that 100 = 10 tens or 100 ones

Step 2: Recognize 100 in place value

- Hundreds = 1 × 100 = 100
- Tens = 0 × 10 = 0
- Ones = 0 × 1 = 0

Step 3: Use 100 to build bigger numbers like 101, 120, 150, and so on Examples with Solutions

Example 1:

How many tens are in 100?

Solution: 10 × 10 = 100

Answer: 10 tens

Example 2:

Write 100 in place value

Solution: Hundreds = 1, Tens = 0, Ones = 0

Answer: 100 = 1 hundred + 0 tens + 0 ones

Example 3:

What comes after 99?

Solution: 99 + 1 = 100

Answer: 100

Example 4:

What comes before 101?

Solution: 101 – 1 = 100

Answer: 100

Example 5:

Write 100 In expanded form

Solution: 100 = 100 + 0 + 0

Answer: 100

Summary Points

- One hundred is the first 3-digit number
- It has 1 in hundreds, 0 in tens, and 0 in ones
- 100 = 10 tens or 100 ones
- It comes after 99 and before 101
- One hundred helps in grouping and counting big numbers
