Pronouns

Definition of a Pronoun

A pronoun is a word that is used in place of a noun. It helps us avoid repeating the same noun multiple times.

Examples:

- Suraj bought two packets of crayons. He kept one and gave the other to his friend.
- Jhalak: "Shraddha, show me the new pen."
- Shraddha: "I forgot to bring it, Jhilik."

In these examples:

• "He", "me", "I", "it" replace names like Suraj, Jhilik, and the object (pen).

Types of Pronouns

i. Personal Pronouns

Used to refer to people or things.

Examples:

• I, you, he, she, it, we, they, me, him, her, us, them

Singular	Plural
I, me	we, us
you	you
he, him	they, them
she, her	
it	

ii. Possessive Pronouns

Show ownership or belonging.

Examples: mine, yours, his, hers, ours, theirs

iii. Demonstrative Pronouns

Point to specific things: this, that, these, those

iv. Reflexive Pronouns

Refer back to the subject: myself, yourself, himself, etc.

How Pronouns Work in Sentences

- Suraj is a noun: He, his, and him are pronouns replacing "Suraj".
- Rahul and Rohit: "We" (if speaking), "Us" (object form).
- Pen: "It" (used for objects and animals when gender is not specified).
