



Simple Future Tense

What is Simple Future Tense?

The simple future tense is used to describe actions or events that are likely to happen in the future.

It tells what someone will do or what will happen at a later time.

Structure of Simple Future Tense

Type of Sentence	Structure	Example
Affirmative	Subject + will/shall + base verb	I will visit my uncle.
Negative	Subject + will/shall + not + base verb	He will not come tomorrow.
Interrogative	Will/Shall + subject + base verb + ?	Will she go to the park?

Note: "Shall" is now mostly replaced by "will" even with I and we in modern usage.

Key Rules and Points to Remember

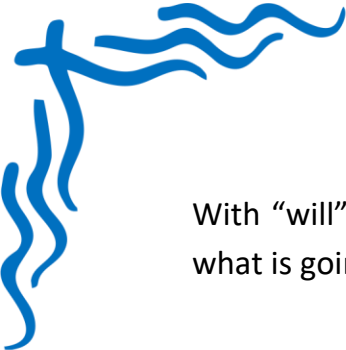
- Use “will” or “shall” with the base form of the verb.
- Time expressions like tomorrow, next week, soon, later, in an hour are often used.
- The helping verb doesn’t change for different subjects in the future tense.

Examples from the Chapter

- ❖ KKR will win the match tomorrow.
- ❖ Priya will sing a song on stage.
- ❖ Madhuri will buy a new dress.
