Prepositions

Definition

A preposition is a word used to show the relationship of one thing to another in a sentence.

Examples

- The book is on the table.
- o "on" shows the relation between the book and the table.
- The fruits are in the basket.
- "in" shows the relation between the fruits and the basket.
- The farmer is under the tree.
- o "under" shows the relation between the farmer and the tree.
- The baby is near her mother.
- o "near" shows the relation between the baby and her mother.

Common Prepositions

Some important and commonly used prepositions are:

- in, on, under, over, behind, in front of, before, after
- near, between, by, with, into, at, for, from
