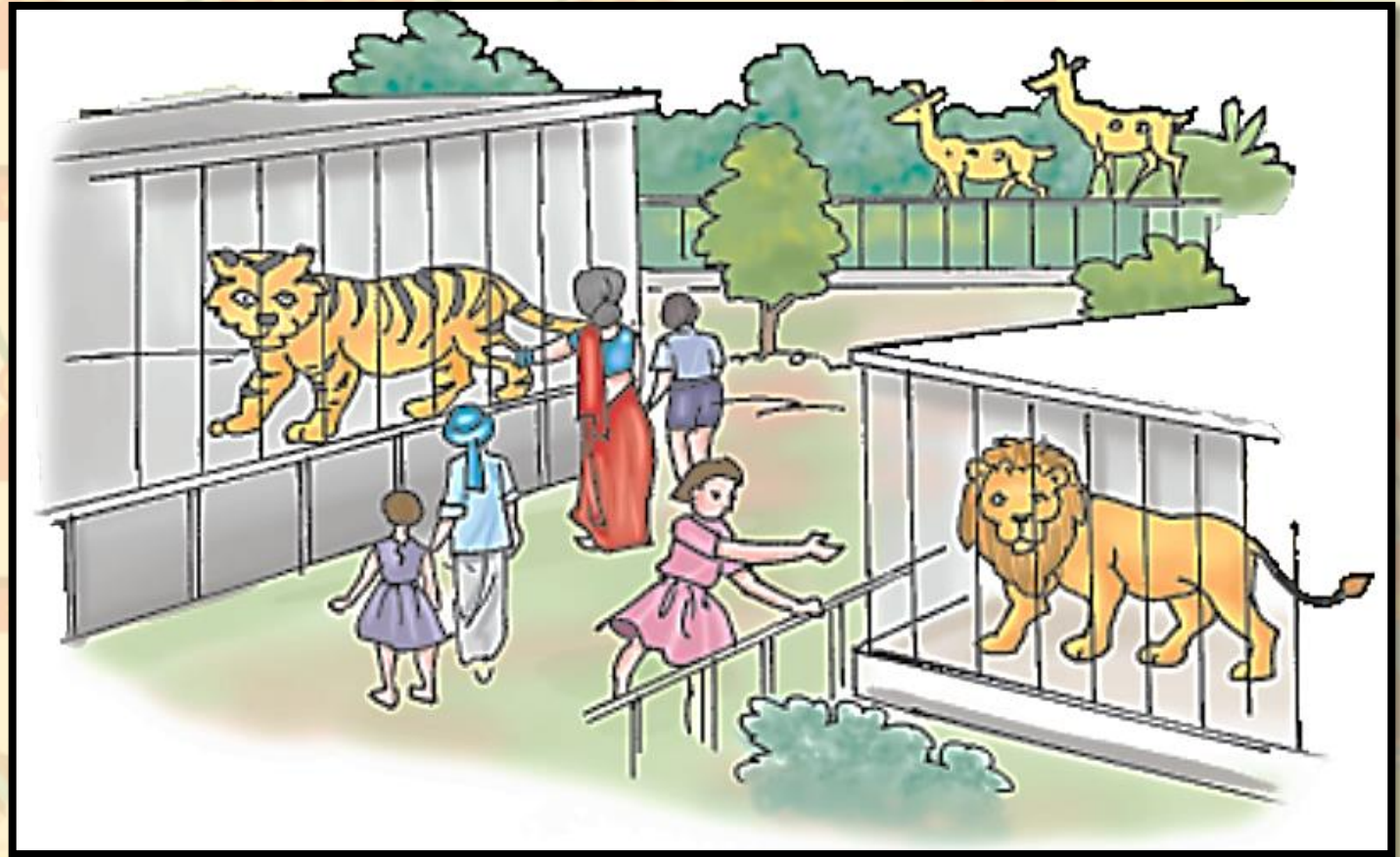
Introduction

PAST, PRESENT AND FUTURE

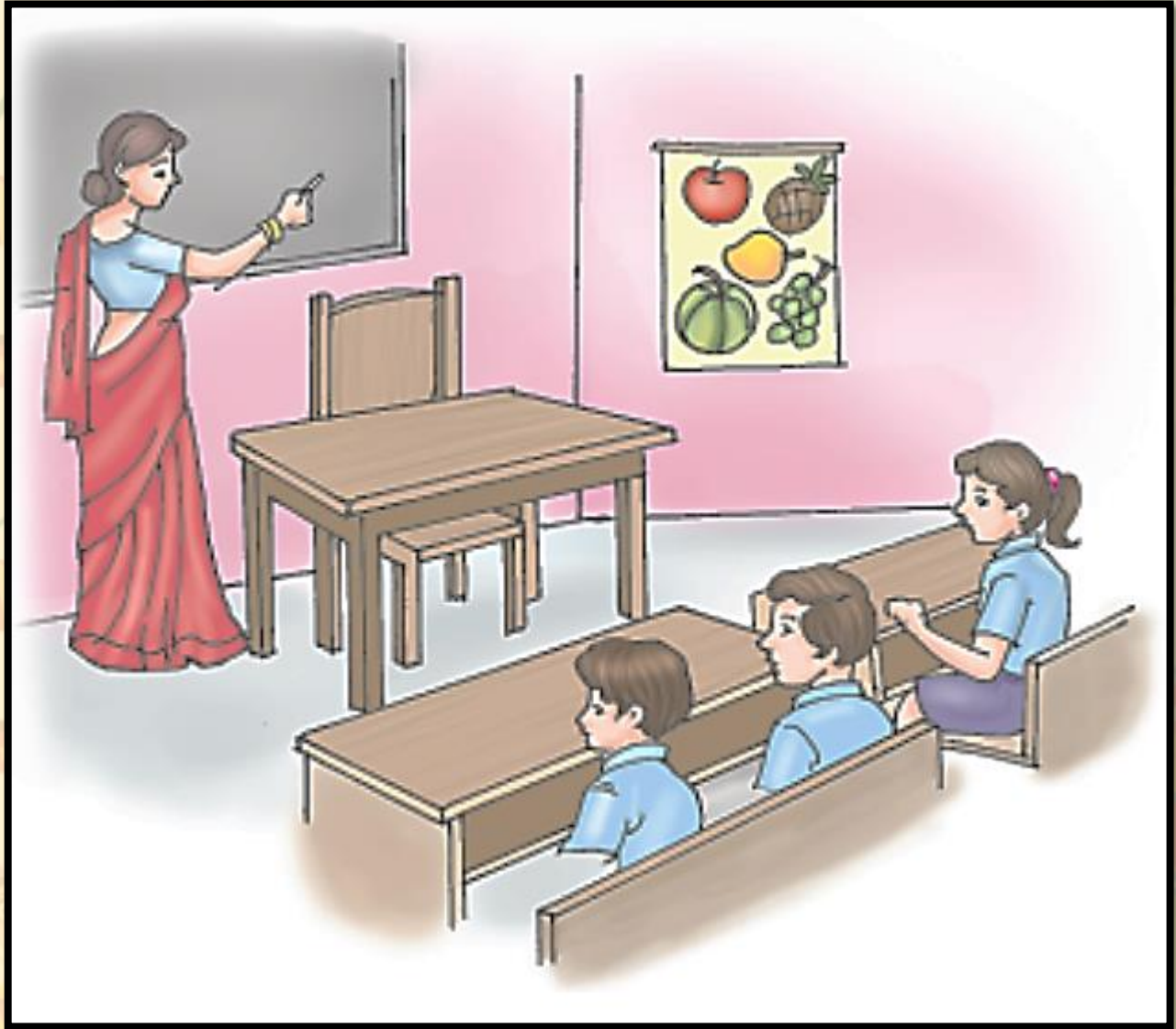
Last summer,

- We remember any event by its time and date.
- Each year starts with 1st January and ends with 31st December.
- A leap year occur once after every four years, which has 366 days.
