They migrate each year in a particular season to escape from harsh climatic conditions. Birds migrate to avoid cold winter and in search of enough food supply.

They migrate in summer to avoid the heat and in search of proper nesting sites. Birds migrate from northern regions to the southern regions in autumn and early winter. They undertake their return journey during spring and early summer. Examples of migratory birds include the Arctic tern and Siberian crane.
