

## Sources of water

There are mainly three forms of water- Solid, liquid and gas/vapor.



### Solid Form: Ice

- A. Ice is water in its frozen, solid form.
- B. Ice often forms on lakes, rivers and the ocean in cold weather.
- C. It can be very thick or very thin.
- D. As it is lighter than water so it can easily float on it.



### Liquid Form: Water

- A. A large portion of the total water on earth is present in liquid form.
- B. Oceans, seas, lakes, rivers, rain and ground water are the main source of the liquid form of water.
- C. It can take any shape.
- D. We also drink liquid form of water.



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### Gaseous Form: Water Vapour

- A. The gaseous form of water is called water vapor.
- B. When water is being heated, 'steam' is a gaseous form of water that rises into the air.
- C. This conversion of water into vapor is known as evaporation.
- D. When we put wet clothes under sun to dry, water from clothes goes to the air.
