What is a Sentence?

A sentence is a group of words that makes complete sense.

Example of Correct Sentences:

- 1. An orange is a fruit.
- 2. The orange is juicy.
- 3. Rupa loves to eat oranges.

These examples express complete thoughts and are grammatically correct.

Example of Incorrect Word Groups (Not Sentences):

- 1. fruit a is an orange
- 2. juicy is the orange
- 3. loves to eat Rupa orange

These groups do not make any sense. They are not sentences because the words are not in proper order.

Key Features of a Sentence

- It expresses a complete idea or thought.
- It must contain a verb.
- It always begins with a capital letter.
- It usually ends with a punctuation mark:
- Full stop (.) for statements
- Question mark (?) for questions
- Exclamation mark (!) for strong feelings or commands

Grammar Byte – Sentence Correction

Some word groups are not full sentences but can be turned into one:

Not a Sentence	Converted to Sentence
my best friend	He is my best friend.
after the meal	We went for a walk after the meal.
at the gate	The dog is sitting at the gate.

Important Rules to Remember

- A sentence = complete sense + verb
- Start with a capital letter
- End with a punctuation mark (., ?, !)
- Each sentence must be clear and meaningful
