Past Continuous Tense

What is Tense?

Tense refers to the time of an action. It shows when something happens — in the present, past, or future.

Types of Tense

Tense Type	Description	Example
1	Shows an action happening now or a general fact	Radhika is present today. We do our homework every day. I eat my breakfast.
Past Tense	Shows an action that already happened	Radhika was present yesterday. We did our homework yesterday. I ate my breakfast.
Future Tense		Radhika will be absent tomorrow. We will do our homework tomorrow. I will eat my breakfast.

Grammar Byte

Tense is the form of the verb that shows the time of the action. Keywords that help identify tenses:

o **Present:** now, today

o **Past:** yesterday, last week

o **Future:** tomorrow, next week

Verb Forms Example:

o I am (present)

o I was (past)

I will be (future)

Base Verb	Past Tense	Future Tense
blow	blew	will blow
begin	began	will begin
write	wrote	will write
pay	paid	will pay
make	made	will make
lose	lost	will lose
leave	left	will leave
know	knew	will know
draw	drew	will draw
do	did	will do
eat	ate	will eat
see	saw	will see
go	went	will go
drive	drove	will drive
drink	drank	will drink

And many more, including: catch, give, read, run, swim, win, sleep, etc.

Important Points to Remember

- Verbs change form based on the time of action.
- Verbs in a sentence help determine if the sentence is in Present, Past, or Future.
- The form of verbs in sentences is essential to understand tense.
