Simple Future Tense

Introduction

Simple Future Tense is used to express actions that are expected to happen in the future.

Examples:

- I shall buy a book.
- She will come at 8 o'clock.

These verbs express an intention or event that has not happened yet but is expected to happen later.

Learning Outcomes

By the end of this lesson, students will:

- Understand and use the simple future tense of verbs.
- Be able to form correct sentences using "will" or "shall."

Formation of Simple Future Tense

Structure:

Subject + shall/will + base form of verb

- "Shall" is used with I and We.
- "Will" is used with all other subjects (He, She, It, You, They).

Examples:

- I shall buy a book.
- We shall go to the park.
- They will play the match.
- She will sing a song.

Short Forms (Contractions):

- I shall → I'll
- We will → We'll
- They will → They'll

Usage of Simple Future Tense

Used to talk about:

- Future actions or decisions
- Promises or intentions
- Predictions

Time Indicators:

- tomorrow
- next week
- next month
- in the evening
- when I grow up

Key Rules to Remember:

- Use shall/will + base form of the verb.
- Use to express future time.
- Commonly paired with time expressions referring to future.
