Common and Proper Nouns

1. Collective Nouns

Definition:

Collective nouns refer to the names of a group or collection of persons, animals, or things taken as a whole.

Examples in Sentences:

- The watchman has a bunch of keys.
- There is a flock of sheep in the meadow.
- An army of soldiers shot down the terrorists.

Common Collective Nouns:

bunch	group of keys, flowers
flock	group of birds, sheep
army	group of soldiers
class	group of students
team	group of players
choir	group of singers
herd	group of cattle
swarm	group of bees
pack	group of wolves or cards

troop	group of monkeys
library	group of books
pride	group of lions
band	group of musicians
flight	group of birds
fleet	group of ships
litter	group of puppies

Definition:

Abstract nouns refer to ideas, qualities, feelings, and concepts that cannot be seen or touched.

Examples in Sentences:

- 3. Greed is a curse.

These nouns reflect thoughts or qualities like bravery, wisdom, kindness, happiness, etc.
