Nouns Number

Definition of Number in Nouns

• A Singular Noun refers to one person, place, animal, or thing.

Examples: boy, girl, kite, potato, book, pen

• A Plural Noun refers to more than one person, place, animal, or thing.

Examples: boys, girls, kites, potatoes, books, pens

Rules for Changing Singular to Plural

- 1. Add "-s" to most nouns
 - **Examples:**

cat → cats

balloon → balloons

game → games

shoe → shoes

- 2. Add "-es" to nouns ending in s, ss, sh, ch, x, or o (hissing sounds)
 - **Examples:**

brush → brushes

watch → watches

 $box \rightarrow boxes$

tomato → tomatoes

Exceptions:

photo → photos

piano → pianos

- 3. Nouns ending in -f or -fe change to -ves
 - **Examples:**

leaf → leaves

wolf \rightarrow wolves
    knife → knives
* Exception:
    roof \rightarrow roofs

4. Nouns ending in a consonant + y → change "y" to "i" and add "-es"

baby → babies

 $city \rightarrow cities$

story → stories

5. Nouns ending in vowel + y → just add "-s"

***** Examples:

boy → boys

 $toy \rightarrow toys$

monkey → monkeys

6. Irregular Plural Nouns (change word entirely or stay the same)

***** Examples:

 $man \rightarrow men$

woman → women

child → children

foot \rightarrow feet

tooth → teeth

mouse → mice

deer → deer

sheep → sheep

 $ox \rightarrow oxen$

Special Compound Noun Plurals

- mother-in-law → mothers-in-law
- passer-by → passers-by
- **commander-in-chief** → commanders-in-chief

Important Points to Remember

Examples to Practice

 - \rightarrow I saw deer in the woods.
- 2. There is a bird on the tree.
 - → There are birds on the tree.
- 3. I caught a fish.
 - \rightarrow I caught fish.
