

# Simple Past Tense

#### **Definition**

The Simple Past Tense is used to describe:

- Actions that happened in the past
- Events that are completed

### **Example:**

My father left for Delhi yesterday.

## **Structure of the Simple Past Tense**

#### **Affirmative Sentences**

## Subject + Verb (Past form) + Object

- We played a friendly match yesterday.
- They went to Delhi last week.

### **Negative Sentences**

### Subject + did not + Base form of verb

- She did not eat her lunch.
- We did not watch TV.

### **Interrogative Sentences**

### Did + Subject + Base form of verb + Object?

- Did you go to the zoo?
- Did he call you?

# When to Use Simple Past Tense

- 1. Completed Actions in the Past
  - **e.g.** The teacher taught the student.

### 2. Past Habits

e.g. My grandfather played badminton with me.

### **Verb Forms**

A verb has three main forms:

- Present
- Past
- Past Participle

Regular Verbs: Add -ed to the base form

- $play \rightarrow played$
- cook → cooked

Irregular Verbs: Change completely or remain the same

- go → went
- write → wrote
- **see** → saw
- meet → met

# **Examples:**

| Verb (Present) | Past Tense |
|----------------|------------|
| play           | played     |
| drink          | drank      |
| write          | wrote      |
| eat            | ate        |
| see            | saw        |
| teach          | taught     |

| Verb (Present) | Past Tense |
|----------------|------------|
| sing           | sang       |
| know           | knew       |

### **Change to Simple Past Tense:**
