

Simple Future Tense

Definition

The Simple Future Tense is used to describe an action that will happen in the future.

Formation

We form the simple future tense using:

Structure:

shall/will + base (root) form of the verb

- "Shall" is mostly used with I and we.
- "Will" can be used with all subjects (I, you, he, she, it, we, they).

Examples:

- I shall visit my grandparents next Sunday.
- She will buy a new mobile tomorrow.
- They will arrive here next week.

Usage

We use the simple future tense to:

- 1. Express future actions or events that will happen:
 - We shall meet him tomorrow.
 - She will arrive next month.
- 2. Give information about something that will take place:
 - They will attend Roma's birthday party.

Common Time Expressions

The simple future tense is often used with time words like:

- tomorrow
- next week

- next month
 - next year
 - this evening
 - in a few days

Example Sentences:

- I will finish my project by the end of this week.
- She will arrive tomorrow.
- They will leave next week.
