What are Articles?

- Articles are words that define whether a noun is specific or unspecific.
- The three articles in English are:

Types of Articles

1. Indefinite Articles – A, An

Used when referring to a non-specific or any one item of a group.

Use of "A"

- Used before singular countable nouns starting with a consonant sound.
 - a bat, a cat, a dog, a man
- Also used before words starting with a vowel letter but pronounced as consonants:
 - a university, a unicorn, a European

Use of "An"

- Used before singular countable nouns starting with a vowel sound.
 - an apple, an elephant, an orange
- Used before words that begin with a silent 'h':
 - an hour, an honest man, an heir
- Used before abbreviations or acronyms beginning with a vowel sound:
 - an M.P., an M.A., an S.D.O.

2. Definite Article – The

Used when referring to a specific noun that is already known or mentioned.

Use of "The"

- When speaking about something already known or mentioned:
 - I saw a dog. The dog was barking loudly.
- Before superlative degrees of adjectives:
 - The tallest boy, the smartest girl
- With comparative degree when selecting one of two:
 - She is the wiser of the two.
- Before certain expressions:
 - the same, the whole, the both, the only
- When referring to a whole class:
 - The lion is a fierce animal.

Use "The" Before:

- Unique things: the Sun, the Moon
- Rivers: the Ganga, the Yamuna
- Seas & Oceans: the Pacific Ocean, the Arabian Sea
- Deserts & Canals: the Thar Desert, the Panama Canal
- Mountain ranges: the Himalayas, the Alps
- Religious/Epic books: the Quran, the Bible, the Ramayana
- Newspapers: the Times of India
- Famous buildings/monuments: the Red Fort, the Taj Mahal
- Some countries: the USA, the UK

Important Notes & Common Errors

 ★ the India → ✓ India (Don't use "the" with names of countries unless plural or abbreviation) ★ the iron, the beauty (when used as uncountable material/abstract nouns) →
✓ Only use "the" when specifying: The iron used here is costly.
