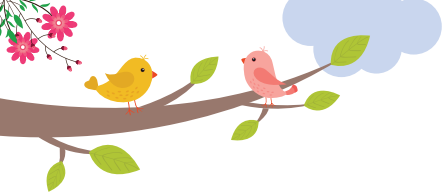

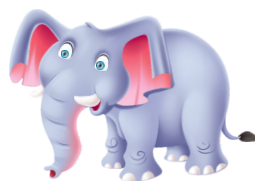
We add only an **Apostrophe (')** for plural nouns which end with **-s**.

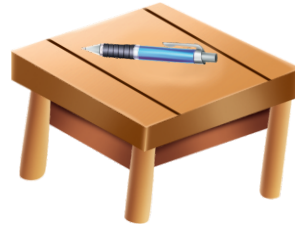

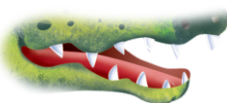

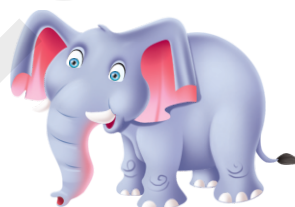
