


Learning Outcomes

- Students will learn that a and an are used for singular nouns and the is used for specific nouns.
- They will understand when to use a and when to use an (based on vowel sounds).



Use of a and an

There are 26 letters in the English alphabet. The 5 letters a, e, i, o, u are called **Vowels**. The other 21 letters are called **Consonants**.

- We use a before words which begin with a Consonant Sound.
- We use an before words which begin with Vowel Sound.
- We use a and an before singular nouns.









Read the following.

a book a pen a cat a mat

an orange an ostrich an ant an umbrella

an apple an eye an owl an inkpot



When the first letter of a word is silent and the second letter produces a **Vowel Sound**, then we use **an** before it.

Example: an honest man, an hour


