A **Joining Word** joins words or groups of words. It also joins two sentences.

Read the following sentences.

Litan has a bat.

Litan has a ball.

Can we join these two sentences to make a single sentence?

Yes, we can. We can say—

Litan has a bat and ball.

We use and to join two words or short sentences.

Now, read these sentences.

Deepika is tall.

Ritika is short.









- A word which is used to join together words, groups of words or sentences is called a Joining Word.
- A joining word is also called a Conjunction.Examples: and, but, or, because

Can we join these two sentences to make a single sentence?

Yes, we can. We can say—

Deepika is tall but Ritika is short.



We use **but** to join two sentences that show different or opposite ideas.

Let us look at two more sentences.

Do you want tea?

Do you want coffee?



Can we join these two sentences to make a single sentence?

Yes, we can. We can say—

Do you want tea or coffee?

We use or to join words or sentences that show choices.

The words and, but and or are joining words.
