#### **Learning Outcomes**

- Students will differentiate between a statement and a question.
- They will learn to form questions using question words like what, where, and why.
- They will practice rewriting statements and questions.

#### Sentence


We already know that a group of words that makes a complete sense is called a **Sentence**.

#### **Statement**

A sentence that tells something is called a **Statement**.

#### **Examples:**

- 1. My name is Ashok.
- 2. He is my father.
- 3. They are my friends.
- 4. She is my sister.
- 5. You are my best friend.









• A Statement always ends with a full stop (.).

#### Question

A sentence that asks something is called a Question.

#### **Example:**

- 1. What is your name?
- 2. Why are you crying?
- 3. Where is your father?
- 4. Who is your class teacher?
- Do you know him?
