Learning Outcomes

- Students will understand the difference between common nouns and proper nouns.
- They will identify proper nouns by their capital letters.
- They will practice sorting nouns into common and proper categories.



Read how these two girls are Introducing themselves.



I am a girl.
I like to eat chocolates.
I live in a city.
I have a pet dog.

My name is **Kajol**.
I like to eat **Kit Kat**.
I live in **Kolkata**.
My pet dog's name is **Max**.

All people, animals, places or things have a name. Names are naming words. Naming words are called **Nouns**.


Common Nouns and Proper Nouns

Nouns that refer to general names of persons, animals, places or things are called **Common Nouns**.

Example: boy, girl, city, river, mountain, etc.

Nouns that refer to particular names of people, animals, places or things are called **Proper Nouns**.

Example: Aman, Monika, Delhi, Tubo, etc.








Now read and compare the following sentences.

The second sentence tells about a particular boy named Ashok who is reading a book.

Boy is a Common Noun. Ashok is a Proper Noun.



Common Nouns

• Common Nouns do not refer to any particular person, place or thing.

Proper Nouns

- Common Nouns begin with small letters.
- Proper Nouns always begin with a capital letter.


