Some nouns are male while others are female. This feature of nouns is called their **Gender**.

The noun boy refers to a male whereas the noun girl refers to a female. The noun king refers to male, whereas the noun queen refers to female. There are males and females in animals too. The nouns bull and lion refer to males, whereas the nouns cow and lioness refer to females.


Formation of the Feminine Gender

There are three ways in which a feminine noun can be formed from a masculine noun:

1. By using an entirely different word.

Examples:

Masculine	Feminine	Masculine	Feminine
dog	bitch	cock	hen
uncle	aunt	king	queen
son	daughter	sir	madam
husband	wife	father	mother





2. By adding 'ess' to the Masculine.

Examples :

Masculine	Feminine	Masculine	Feminine
host	hostess	giant	giantess
author	authoress	prince	princess
lion	lioness	poet	poetess
shepherd	shepherdess	priest	priestess

3. By dropping the vowel before the last letter and adding 'ess'.

Examples :

Masculine	Feminine
waiter	waitress
hunter	huntress
actor	actress
tiger	tigress


Exceptions : In some cases the form is slightly changed before adding 'ess'.

Examples :

Masculine	Feminine
governor	governess
god	goddess


