By Adding -s

Naming Words or Nouns can tell us there is one of something or there is more than one of something. The nouns that name one thing are called **Singular Nouns**. The nouns that name more than one thing are called **Plural Nouns**.

We usually add-s to naming words when we talk about more than one.



By Adding -es

We often add -es if the word ends in -s, -ss, -sh, -ch or-x.

Nouns That End in -y

We also add -es to some words ending in -y. We change the -y to i and then add -es.

Now, look at the pictures and read the words.





• If there is **a**, **e**, **i**, **o**, **u** before **y**, we simply add -**s** to make the nouns **Plural**. **Examples**: boy – boys, day – days, toy – toys

By Adding -ves

Some words ending in -f or -fe have -ves. We leave out the -f/-fe and add -ves.

Now, look at these pictures and read the words given below.













Some words have the same Singular and Plural form.




