Animals also need a home to live in. Wild animals and birds make their homes themselves.

Domesc` and pet animals live in homes made by us. We can know more about some animals, their homes, babies and their sounds.



A **lion** lives in a **den**.

A baby lion is called a cub.

A lion roars.



A goat lives in a farm. Its baby is called a kid. A goat bleats.



Horse in a Stable

A pig lives in a sty.

A baby pig is called a piglet.

A pig makes a grunng noise.



Lion in a Den

A **cow** lives in a **shed** built by us. Baby cow is called a **calf**.

A cow moos.



Goat in a Farm

A horse lives in a stable built by us.

A baby horse is called a **colt**.

A horse **neighs**.

A cat lives in our house.

Baby of a cat is called a kitten.

A cat mews.



Ducks in a Pond

A **sparrow** lives in a **nest**.

Baby of a sparrow is called a **chick**.

A sparrow **chirps**.



Hens in a Coop

A dog lives in a kennel built by us.
Baby of a dog is called a puppy.
A dog barks.



A duck lives in a pond.

Baby ducks are called ducklings.

A duck quacks.



Sparrow and chicks in a Nest

A hen lives in a coop built by us.
Baby of hen is called a chick.
A hen cackles.


