A word used in place of a noun is called a **pronoun**. Pronouns help avoid repeating nouns in a sentence.

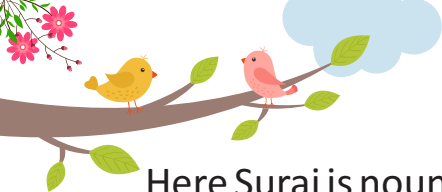
Read the following sentences.

- Suraj bought two packets of crayons. Suraj kept one and gave the other to his friend. His friend thanked Suraj.

We can write these sentence as :

Suraj bought two packets of pencils. **He** kept one and gave the other to **his** friend. **His** friend thanked **him**.





Here Suraj is noun. **He**, **his** and **him** are used in place of nouns. So, these are **pronouns**.

2. Jhalak : Shraddha, show **me** the new pen.

Shraddha : **I** forget to bring **it** Jhilik.

Here **me** stands for Jhilik. **I** stands for Shraddha and **it** stands for pen.

Jhalak, **Shraddha** and **pen** are nouns. **Me**, **I** and **it** are used in place of nouns. So these are pronouns.

3. Rahul and Rohit : **We** are going to picnic, tomorrow.

Will **you** join **us**, Sumit?

Sumit : Yes, certainly.

In these sentences, **we** and **us** stand for Rahul and Raj. Rahul, Raj and Sumit are nouns. **We**, **us** and **your** are words used in place of nouns. These words are called **pronouns**.

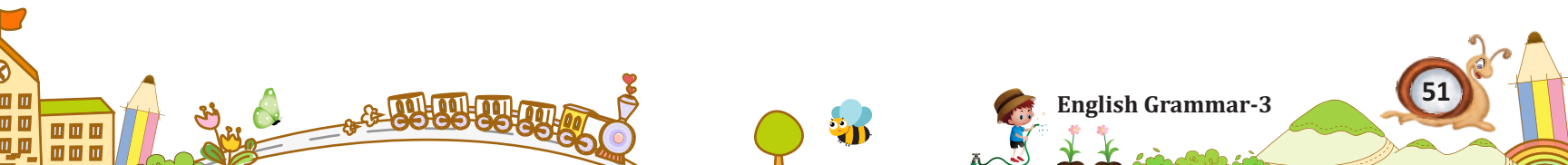
