Vowels and Consonants •

We know that there are 26 letters in the English Alphabet. Of these (a, e, i, o and u) are called vowels. The rest are consonants.

Use of A

A suggests any one person or thing. It is used before words beginning with a consonant sound.









a doll

a cat

a pen



a book

Use of An

An is used before words beginning with a vowel sound.



an umbrella



an egg



an onion



an engine



an apple



an elephant

We also write an ice cream, an ant, an owl, an ox, an artist, an aeroplane, an hour, an honest person, etc.
