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A word that is used to show the relation of one thing to another in a sentence is called a preposition.

The word on shows the relation between the book and the table.

2. The fruits are in the basket.

The word in shows the relation between the fruits and the basket.

3. The farmer is under the tree.

The word under shows the relation between the farmer and the tree.









4. The baby is near her mother.

The word near shows the relation between the baby and her mother.

In the above sentences, the words on, in, near and under show the relation of one thing to another. These words are called prepositions.
