A word that is used to show the relation of one thing to another in a sentence is called a **preposition**.

Read the following sentences.

1. The book is **on** the table.

The word **on** shows the relation between **the book** and **the table**.



2. The fruits are **in** the basket.

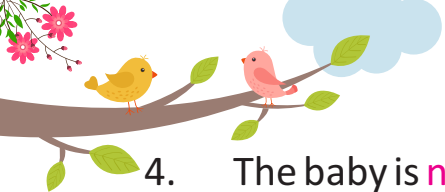
The word **in** shows the relation between **the fruits** and **the basket**.



3. The farmer is **under** the tree.

The word **under** shows the relation between **the farmer** and **the tree**.





4. The baby is **near** her mother.

The word **near** shows the relation between **the baby** and **her mother**.

In the above sentences, the words **on**, **in**, **near** and **under** show the relation of one thing to another. These words are called **prepositions**.

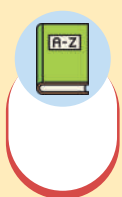
