

#### **Learning Outcomes**

A sentence has two parts - a subject and a predicate.

The part of the sentence that tells us who or what the sentence is about is called the subject.

**Example:** Megha cut a cake.

Who cut a cake? Megha (subject)

The part of the sentence that tells what the subject does is called the predicate.

**Example:** Megha cut a cake.

What did Megha do? cut a cake (predicate)


