

# Nouns : Singular and Plural

#### **Learning Outcomes**

- Students will understand the concept of singular and plural nouns.
- They will learn the rules for forming plurals, including regular and irregular forms.
- They will identify and convert singular nouns to plural and vice versa.

A noun that names only one person, place, thing or animal is called a **singular noun**. A noun that names more than one person, place, thing or animal is called a **plural noun**.

The nouns tomato and brush stand for only one thing. The nouns tomatoes and brushes stand for more than one thing.

But when we say tomatoes or brushes, we speak about more than one tomato and more than one brush.

The nouns book, cup, tomato and brush are in the singular number.

The nouns books, cups, tomatoes and brushes are in the plural number.



Can nouns name one or more persons, places, things or animals?

#### **Formation of Plurals**

Some nouns ending in f or fe change into –ves in the plural.

calf — calves leaf — leaves thief — thieves wife — wives

Most nouns ending in -o have -s.

studio — studios video — videos kilo — kilos photo — photos

Some nouns ending in —o have —es in the plural.

potato — potatoes tomato — tomatoes mosquito — mosquitoes hero — heroes

We add -es to nouns ending in -s, -sh, -ch and -x in the plural.

box — boxes dish — dishes match — matches bus — buses

• Some nouns like sheep and deer do not change in the plural.









When the noun is a compound word, the plural is formed by adding -s to the main noun.

sisters-in-law(right)sister-in-laws (wrong)fathers-in-law(right)father-in-laws (wrong)step-mothers(right)steps-mothers (wrong)
